RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Unadilla Township Board of Trustees have entered into a pilot program with the Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority to provide recycling services to residents of our community.

Two large recycling bins have been placed at the township hall parking lot at 126 Webb St. for residents to drop off their recyclable materials. No trash is permitted at the drop off site. The following materials may be dropped off:

- **Newspaper and junk mail:** Collect in brown paper bag, secure with tape or string, keep dry for drop off
- **Magazines, catalogues, paperback books and phone books:** Collect in brown paper bag separate from newspapers
- **White office paper:** Bag separately from all other papers
- **Cardboard, cereal boxes and paper bags:** Flatten corrugated cardboard boxes and boxboard such as cereal boxes, consolidate brown paper bags together into one bag and separate from other papers
- **Plastic bottles:** Only bottles labeled #1 (PET) or #2 (HDPE) such as milk jugs and detergent bottles, remove caps and lids, rinse well and flatten, labels may be left on. Bag bottles or secure with string, no tubs such as yogurt or butter tubs, no motor oil containers
- **Glass bottles and jars:** Clear, green and brown only (no blue glass), green and brown glass may be mixed, remove caps, steel caps may be recycled with cans, rinse well, labels may be left on. No plates, china, ceramics, mirrors, window glass or light bulbs
- **Tin and aluminum cans:** Aluminum and steel cans and lids, remove labels, rinse well, flatten if possible. Empty aerosol cans are okay, no scrap metal or hangers

The Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority was formed in 1992 through a \$350,000 grant from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. This is a non-profit recycling program which includes the eight member communities of Lyndon, Dexter, Sylvan, Lima, Manchester and Bridgewater Townships; the city of Chelsea and the Village of Manchester. In addition, there are three townships presently participating in a pilot program to offer drop off services. They include Webster, Putnam and Unadilla Townships.
